It's a pipeline leak and should be fixed by February 12, 2024. Included in the board packet are the Employee Safety Meeting and Monthly Field Staff Report for the Board's review. Discussion ensued.

**STATUS OF AUTHORITIES** – The Manager continued forwarding CEO updates from Jason Phillips, CEO of FWA, and the AECA newsletter to the Board members.
